Our park is for the enjoyment of Town of Union Vale residents and their guests.

Rowdiness or any other action which prevents people from enjoying the facility will not be tolerated. All rules will be enforced.

Rules & Regulations

- · Vehicles are only allowed in designated parking areas; park at your own risk
- Stay within the posted property boundaries
- Be considerate of other park visitors and of adjoining property owners
- Horses and dogs are permitted on the Equestrian Center side of Duncan Rd. Keep dogs leashed at all times and clean up after horses and dogs
- Do not remove or destroy plants, wildlife, artifacts, or property
- Smoking is permitted at least 50 feet away from all Town infrastructure, including play-spaces
- Play radios or other sound devices at a respectful volume
- Put all trash and recyclables in the receptacles provided
- Please check-in at Park Office prior to relic hunting/use of metal detectors
- Stay on marked trails
- · Snowmobiles are permitted on the Equestrian Center side of the park; they are allowed on marked trails when there is more than 6inches of snow
- No guns or weapons of any kind

Prohibited Activities

- Motorized vehicles (see accessibility statement for more)
- Motorized watercraft
- Camping (except by permit, where allowed)
- Campfires or bonfires
- Swimming (except at the pool, with lifeguard on duty)
- Hunting
- Fishing without a DEC license and Tymor Pass
- Dumping and littering
- Feeding wildlife
- Consuming alcohol (except by permit)
- · Consuming drugs of any kind
- Drones or other remote-controlled flying devices

Caution

- The Town is not responsible for lost, stolen, or broken property
- Deer ticks, which can transmit Lyme disease, are a growing problem in this area; take precautions and check for ticks after leaving
- Our trails are multi-use, meaning cyclists, walkers, horses, skiers, etc. may be all using the same trail at the same time; please be respectful of all persons using the trails; be sure to keep dogs on leashes and clean up after your animals
- Exercise caution when using the trails alone

Accessibility

We strive to provide quality experiences for all persons. If you have questions about accessibility, please call so we can best assist you.

- Service and assistance animals are welcome in any area of our park; as there are parts of the park where pets are not allowed, it is recommended that service and assistance animals be clearly identifiable.
- The use of motorized mobility devices (no more than 32inches wide and 150lbs) is allowed on any areas used by pedestrians so long as they maintain a safe speed (no more than 10MPH) and do not impede on wildlife. Individuals using mobility devices should carefully consider whether their mobility device can safely operate given the existing trail conditions.
- Persons who are assisting others will receive free or reduced rates for participation in events and activities
